Psychology

- **Psychology:** Scientific study of behavior and the mind
 - **Scientific:** Uses systematic, objective methods of observation
 - **Behavior:** Any activity that can be observed, recorded, and measured
 - **Mind:** All conscious and unconscious mental states
- Psychology can be divided into two branches
 - **Basic:** Research conducted to test theories and build a foundation of knowledge
 - **Applied:** Research conducted to solve practical human problems

Branches of Psychology

- **Cognitive Psychology:** How people think
- **Developmental Psychology:** How people develop over the lifespan
- **Social Psychology:** Understand social behavior, including group behavior, social interactions, and leadership
- **Clinical Psychology:** Diagnose and treat mental disorders (e.g., anxiety, depression, schizophrenia)
- **Counseling Psychology:** Improve individual functioning through life (e.g., family, marriage, vocational, etc.)
- **Cross-cultural psychology:** How culture influences the mind and behavior
- **Sports psychology:** How psychology influences sports, athletic performance, etc.

| Developmental | How does thinking change from nursery to secondary school? | How can we teach children based on their developmental level? |
| Social | How do friends influence a person's behavior? | How can we create a classroom climate of support among students? |
| Clinical | How do learning disabilities develop? | How can we help a child with a learning disability successfully learn to read? |
