Develop an Oral Story Continuous Assessment (10 points)
DUE: 19 March 2021

Overview

The purpose of this assignment is for you to write an oral story that has value for learning in multiple developmental domains for young children (ages 6 or younger). The oral story can come from any source: a traditional story or personal experience, or **ADAPTED** from a story found on the internet, book, or Holy book.

Your assignment should have the following two headers.

Story. Write the story as you would tell it to young children. Use correct grammar and developmentally appropriate language. Try to keep the story under 500 words, but definitely less than two pages.

Relevant Learning Activities in Other Learning Domains. Describe learning activities in four other subjects (e.g., mathematics, science, social studies, or religious studies) or developmental domains (nutrition/physical health, character development, social development) that are directly linked to the story. Present this information in a table with headers in the table. The first line provides an **example** to guide you.

In the second column, write the subject or developmental domain. In the third column, write the learning objective in that subject/domain. In the fourth column, briefly describe the learning activity. There are two things to accomplish in the description. First, clearly communicate how the learning activity is linked to the story. Second, describe a playful, developmentally appropriate learning activity that meets the learning objective.

Evaluation

- Story is interesting and developmentally appropriate for children under 6 years (4 points)
- Story is written with proper grammar and level of language for young children (2 points)
- Learning activities are clearly linked to the story and reflect a meaningful learning objective in the early years (4 points).
